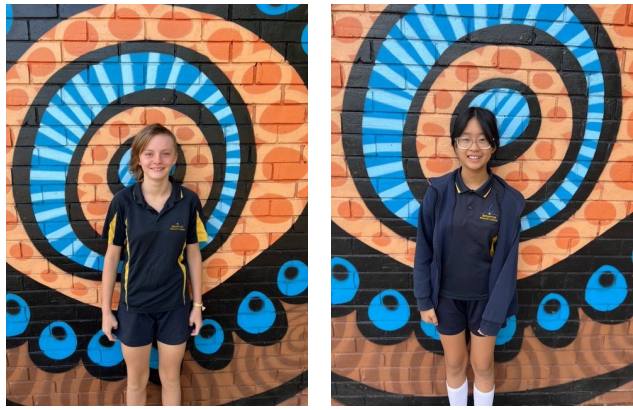

Fruit fly restrictions end at our school

All fruit fly outbreaks end at metropolitan education sites

Thank you to families, students and staff for complying with fruit fly restrictions. All fruit fly outbreaks in Adelaide have now been successfully eradicated which means all fresh fruit and vegetables can once again be packed in school lunchboxes.

While most metropolitan outbreaks were eradicated in December 2021, the last outbreak in Ridleyton ended on 22 February 2022. Please note, some restrictions continue in Riverland outbreak areas. If you are travelling to the Riverland, be mindful of fruit movement restrictions around Renmark West and Pike River.

Seasonal and locally grown fruits like strawberries, apples and pears are not only a healthy lunchbox option but they also add vibrant colour making them enticing and encouraging healthy eating habits.

Even with the outbreaks eradicated, we all need to remain vigilant and do what we can to help prevent fruit fly outbreaks happening again. Fruit fly is more active in the warmer months so now is the time to act.

Prevent fruit fly in your garden at home by:

- Picking fruit as soon as it's ripe
- Collecting any fallen fruit off the ground and put it in your green bin
- Checking fruit for blemishes or maggots
- Calling the Fruit Fly Hotline on **1300 666 010** if you suspect fruit fly and seal the fruit in a plastic bag.

Respect the Wires

The overhead wires and infrastructure along the Gawler rail line are electrified.

They are dangerous if interfered with, carrying 25,000 volts of electricity. Things you need to remember are:

Stand behind the white lines when waiting at a station. The new trains will be quieter and faster and may not be stopping at all stations.



Always use the dedicated overpasses and pedestrian footpaths to access railway stations.



Electrical wires are dangerous, so remember not to play or walk near the train tracks.



Only cross at level crossings and at recognised pedestrian crossings. Don't take shortcuts along or across the railway tracks.



Pay attention, look up and around, listen, and be aware of your surroundings at all times.
