Introduction

About the School Parent Engagement Survey

The Department for Education conducted a new school parent engagement survey from 7 September to 25 September 2020.

As outlined in the 2020 Action Plan, the survey was coordinated centrally by our data and reporting team to remove the additional administration workload from each school. It also replaced the need for schools to conduct a separate survey using the parent questions in the National Schools Opinion Survey.

Parents of school students were sent a link (unique to each school) via email or SMS during the survey period. Schools were also sent copies of their unique survey link so that it could be promoted via school's communication apps, newsletters and social media accounts. This is the first time all parents have been provided the opportunity to directly engage with the department in this way.

Purpose and scope of this report

This report shows the preliminary results from the school parent survey for the parents who responded in 2020.

The report presents the results for your school along with summary data for all parents across public schools.

Please note that completion rates and results from the survey are not measures of your school's performance. This is a new survey specifically designed to gauge how parents engage with students' learning, and the data is intended to support school improvement planning.

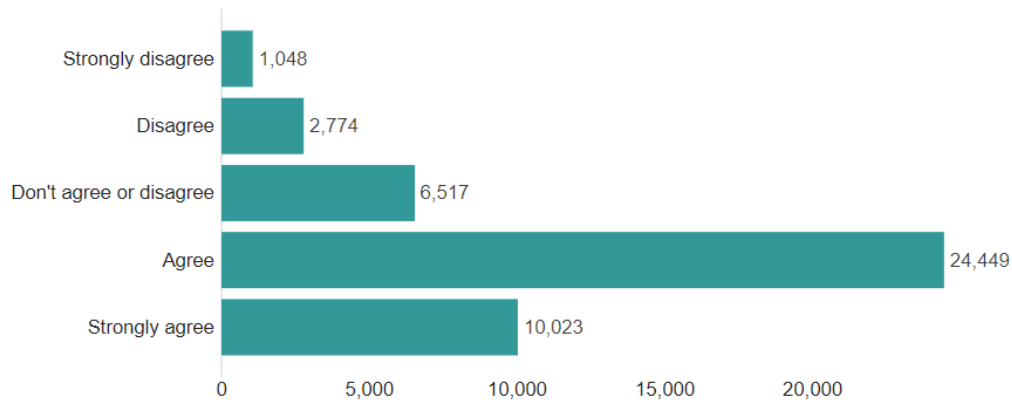

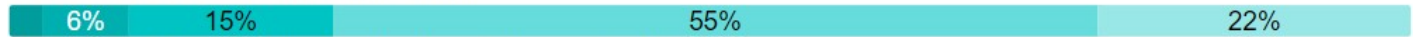

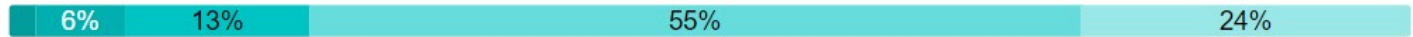

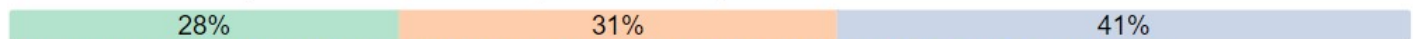

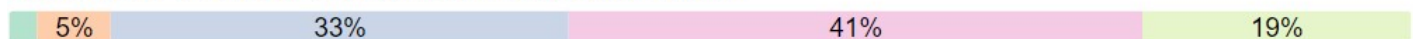

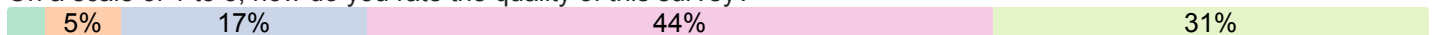

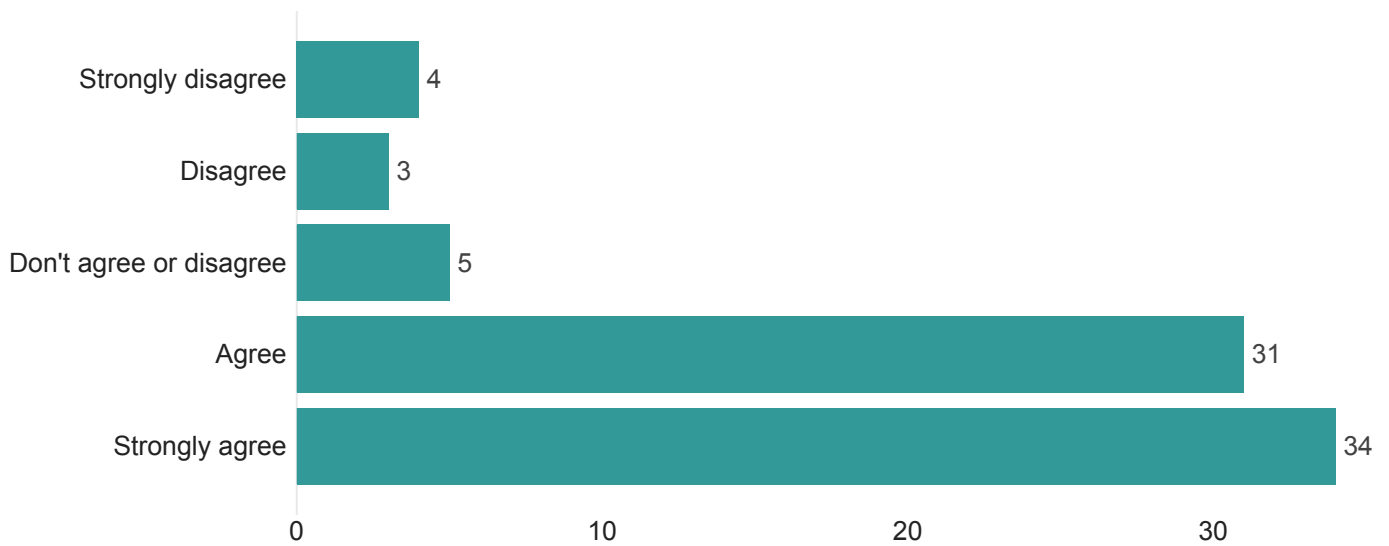

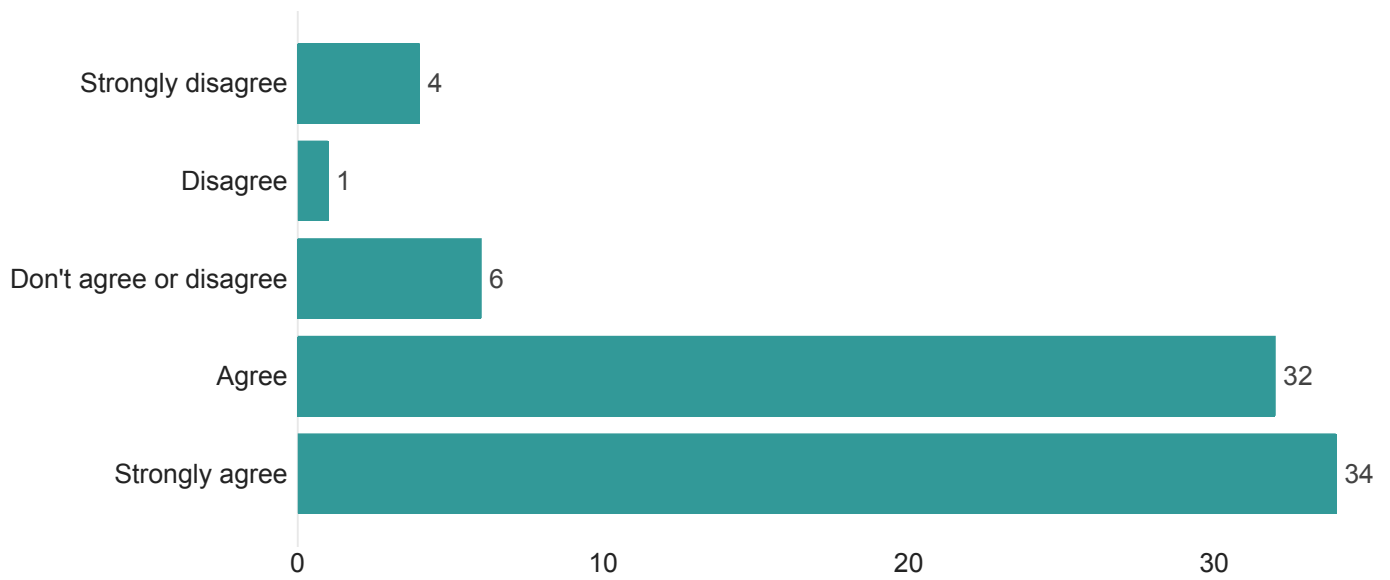

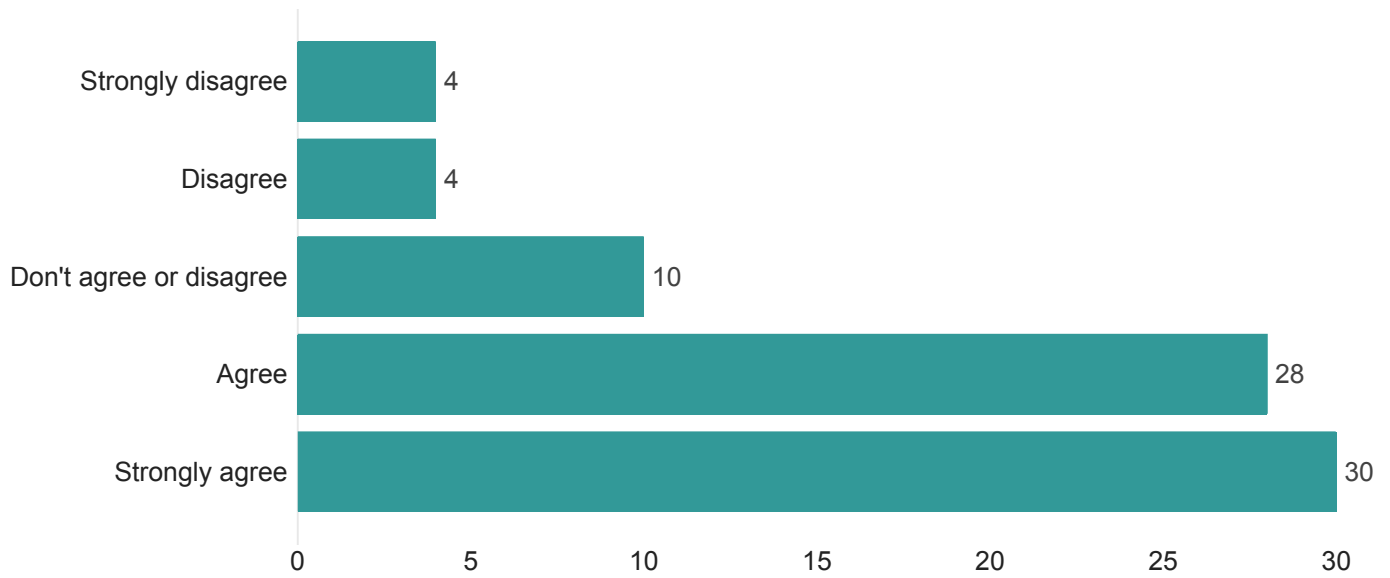

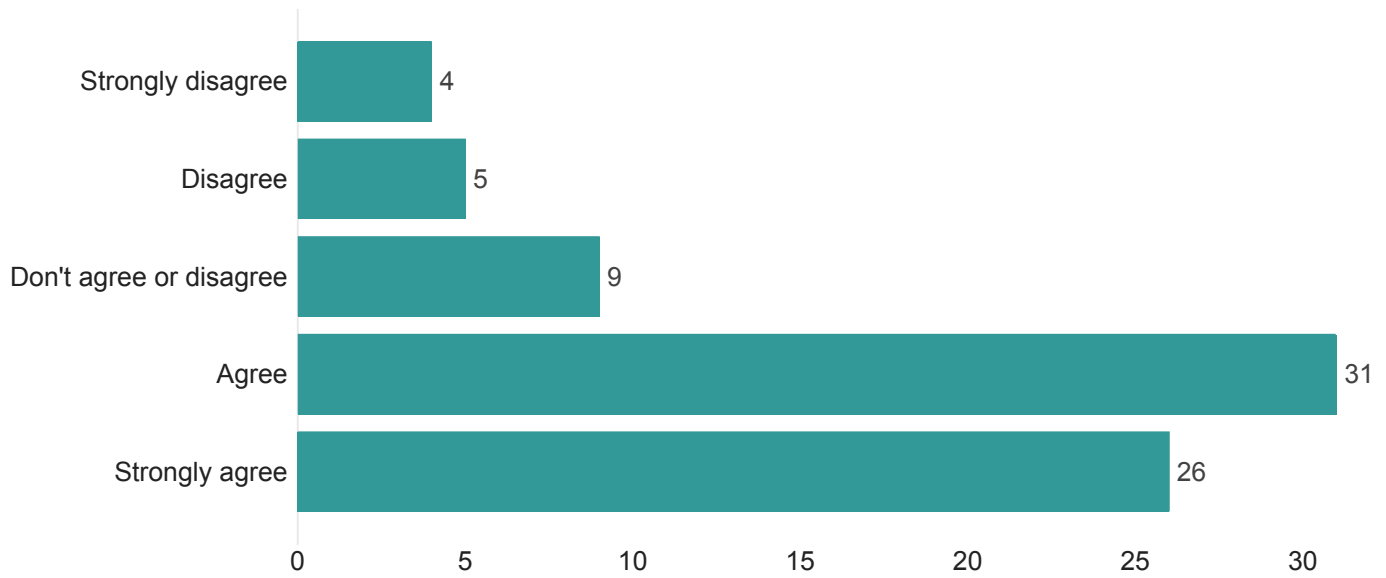

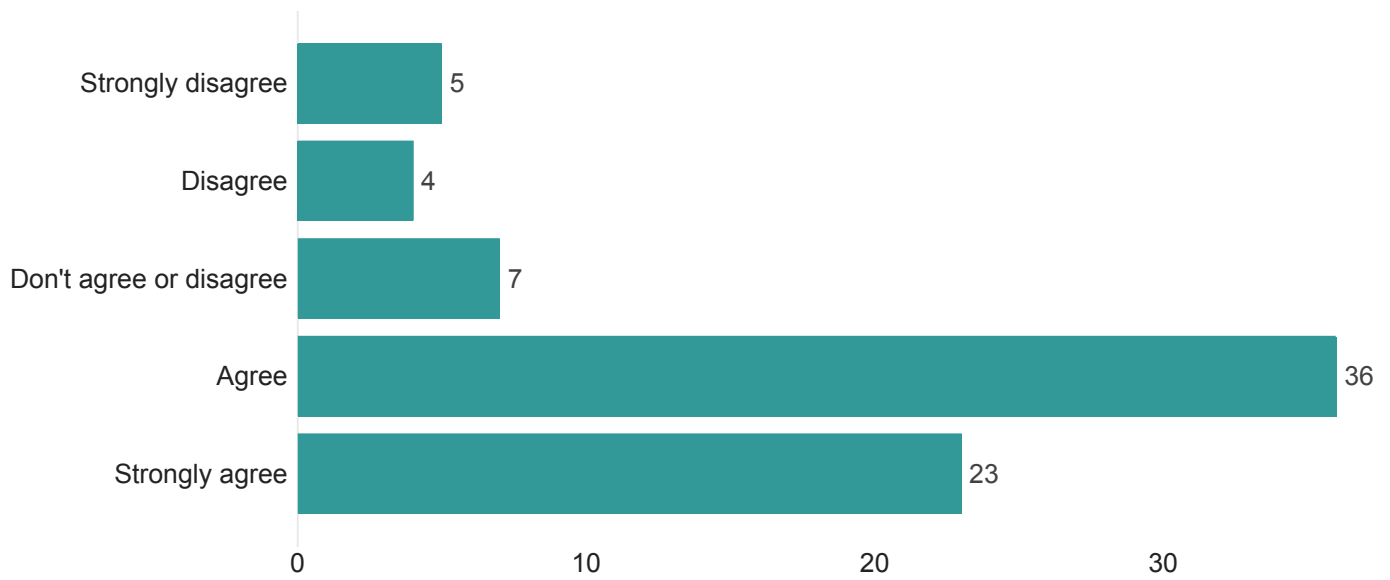

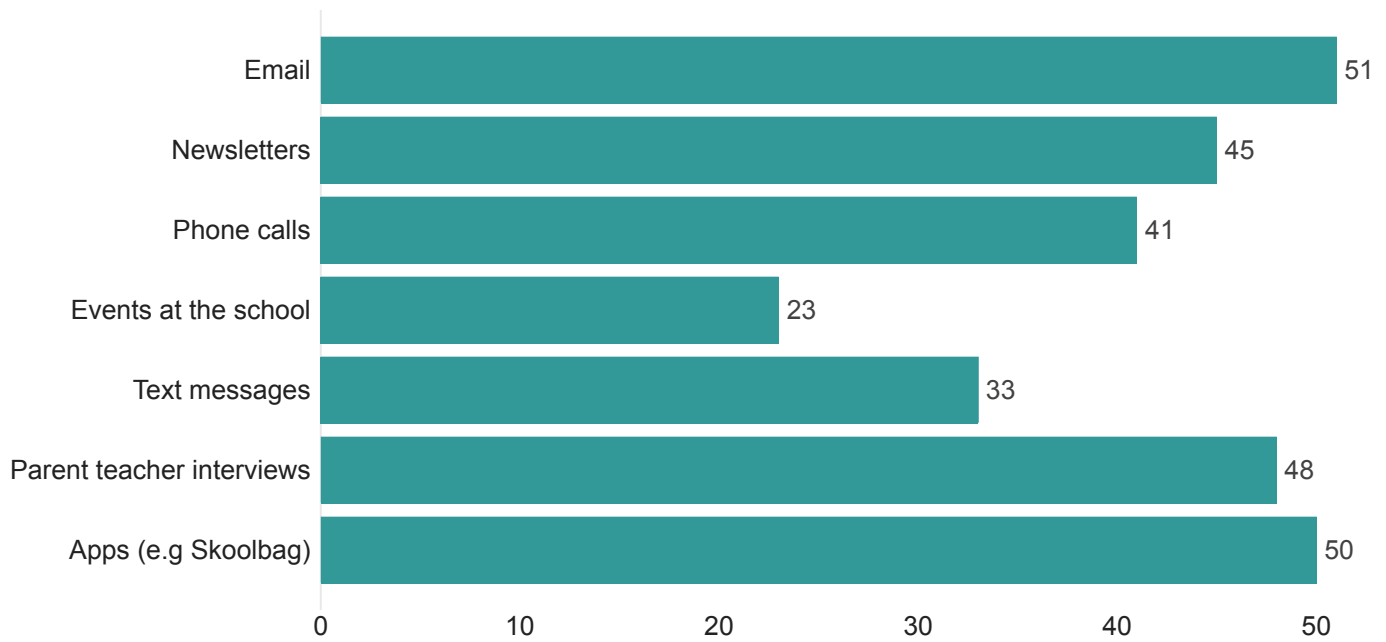

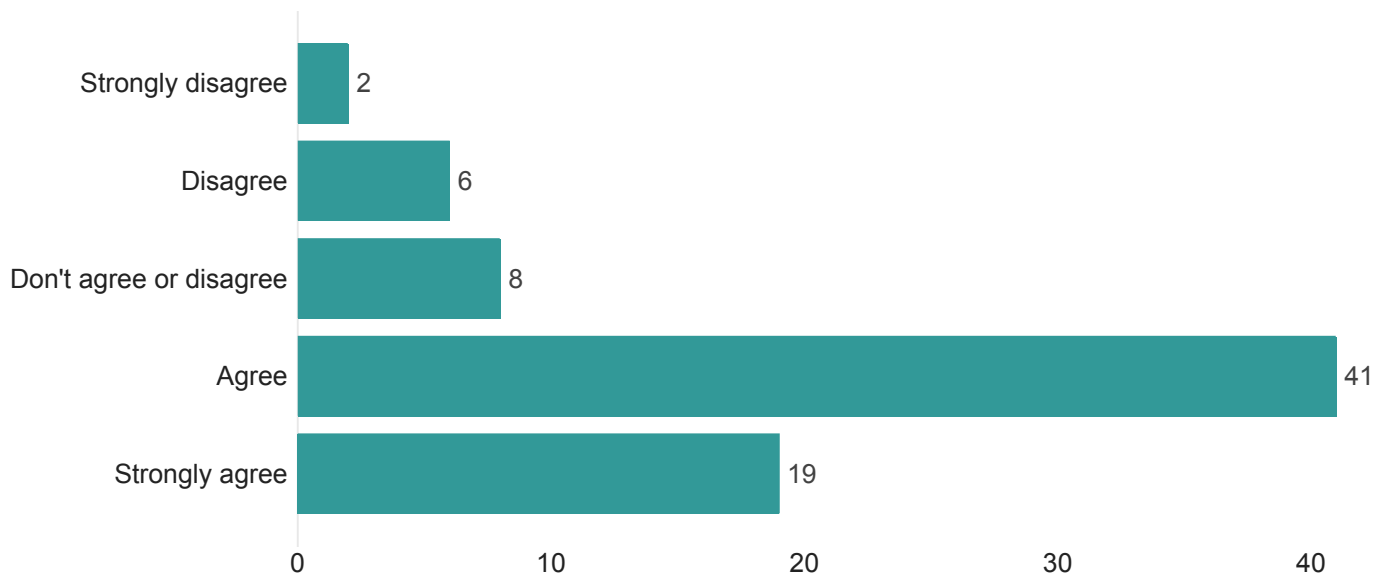

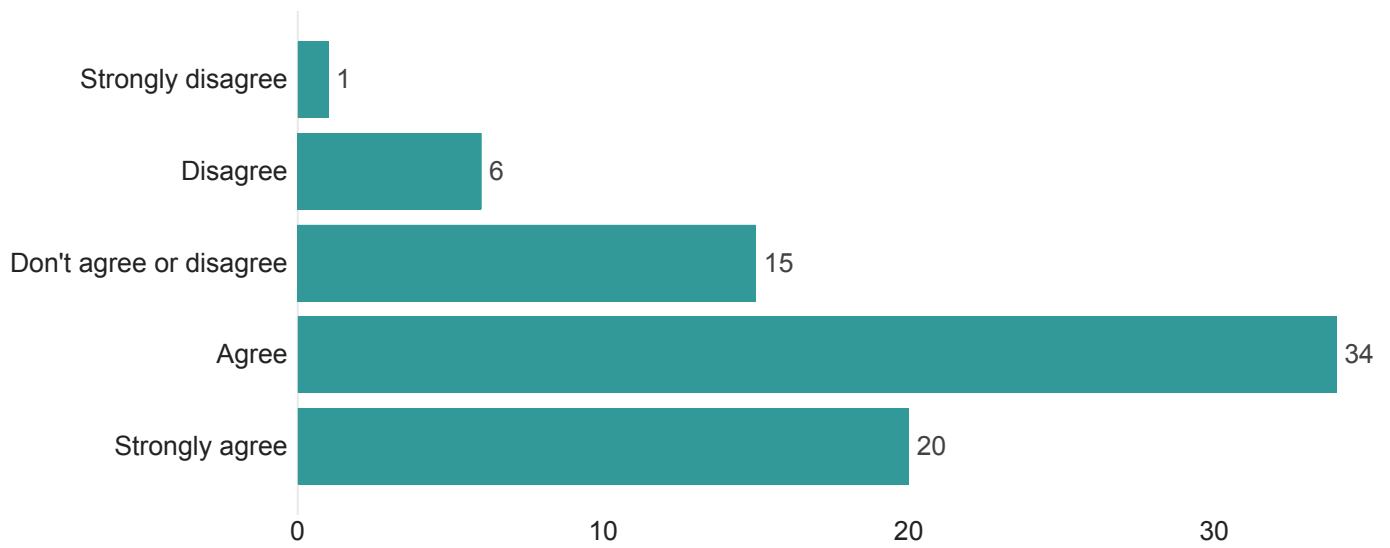

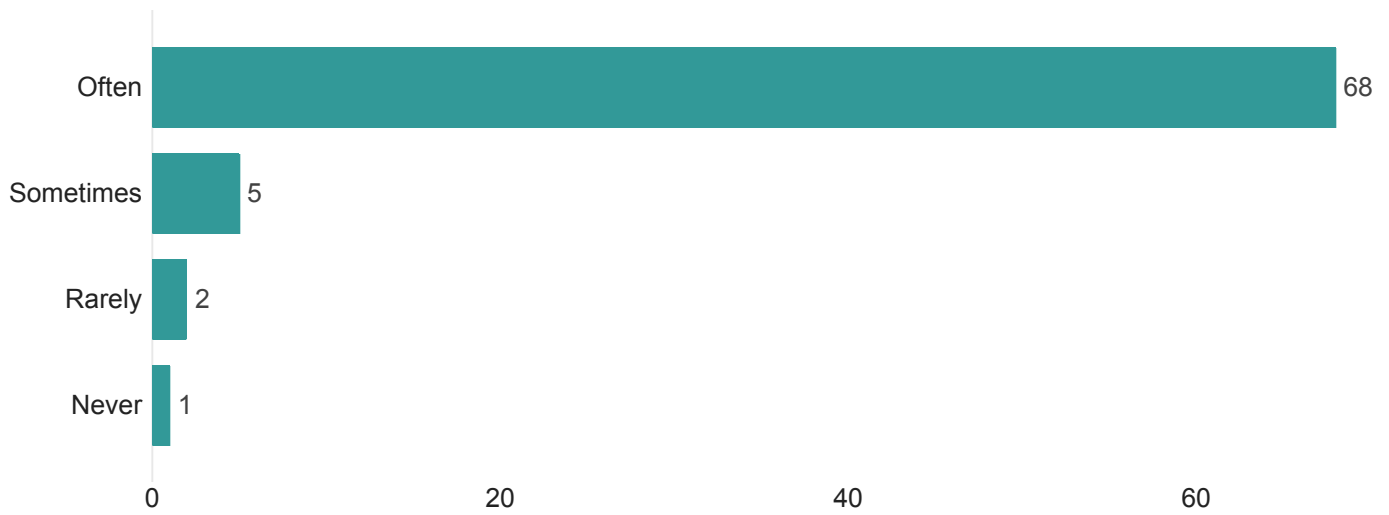

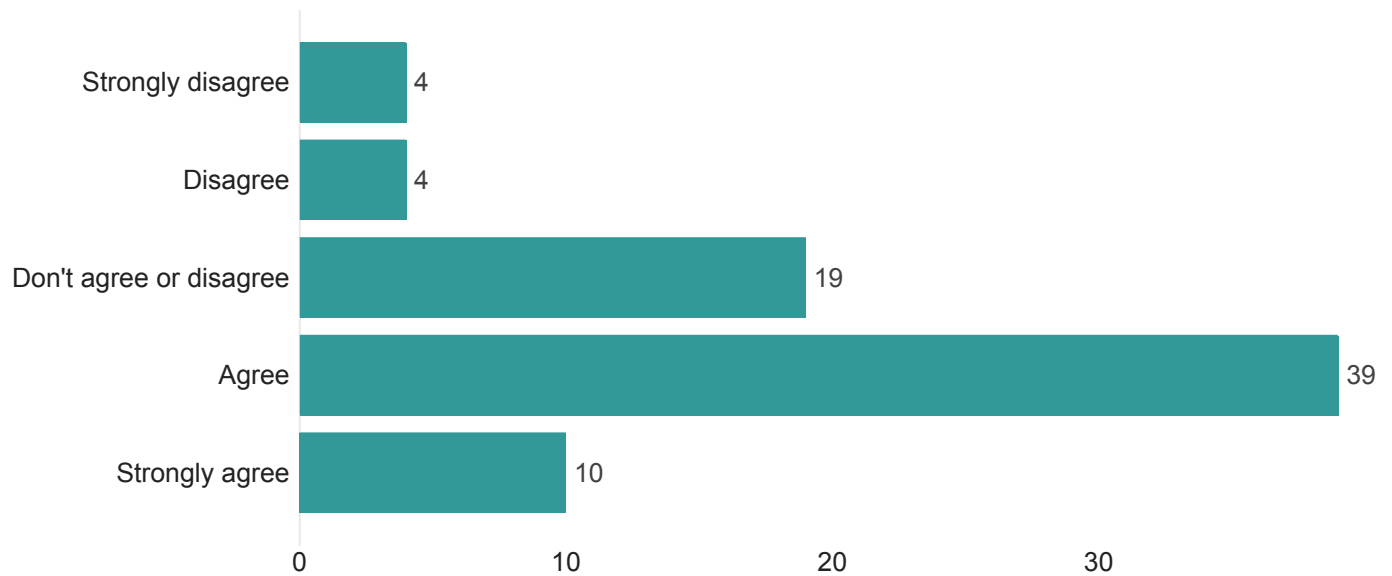

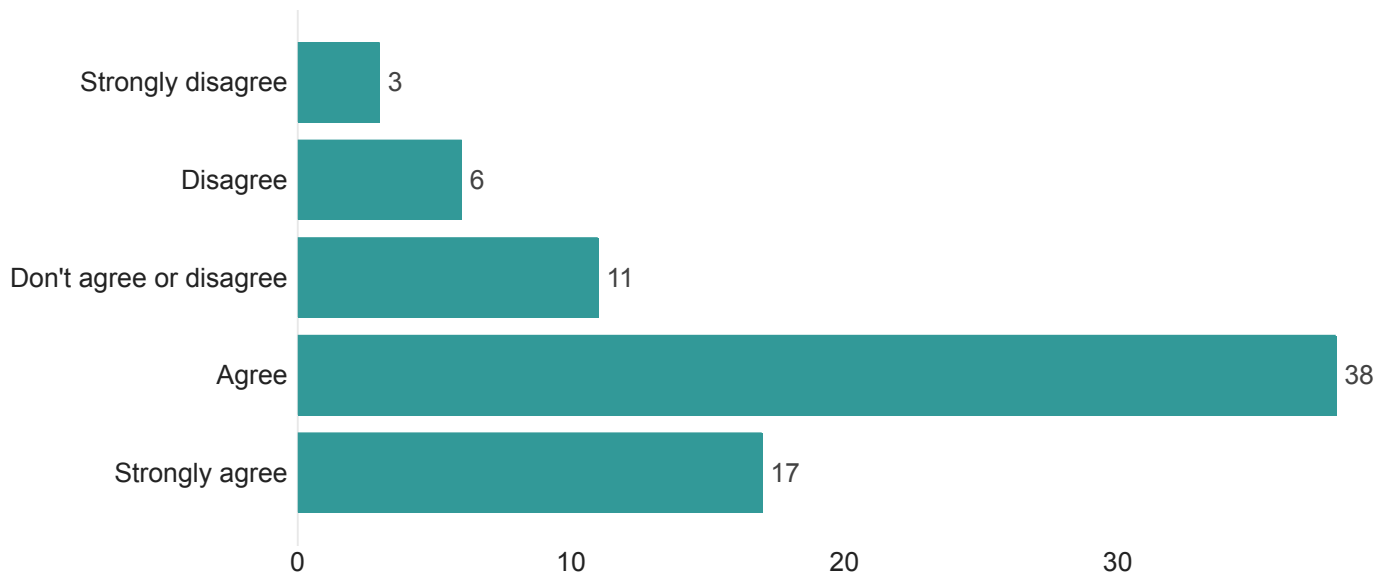

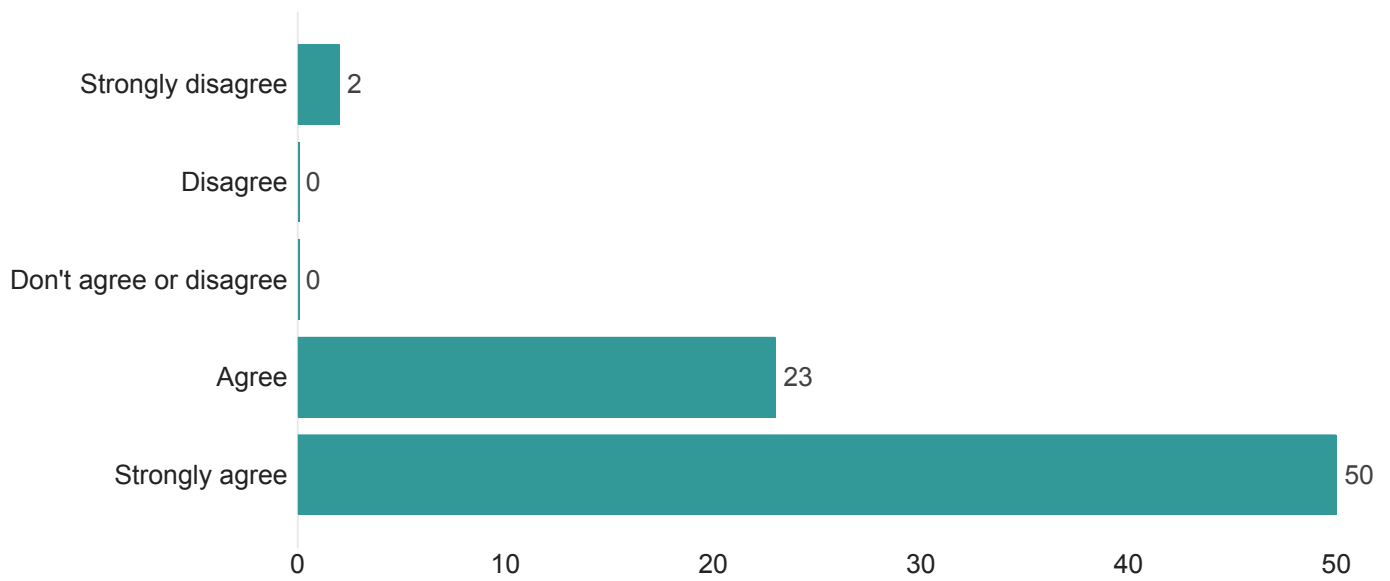

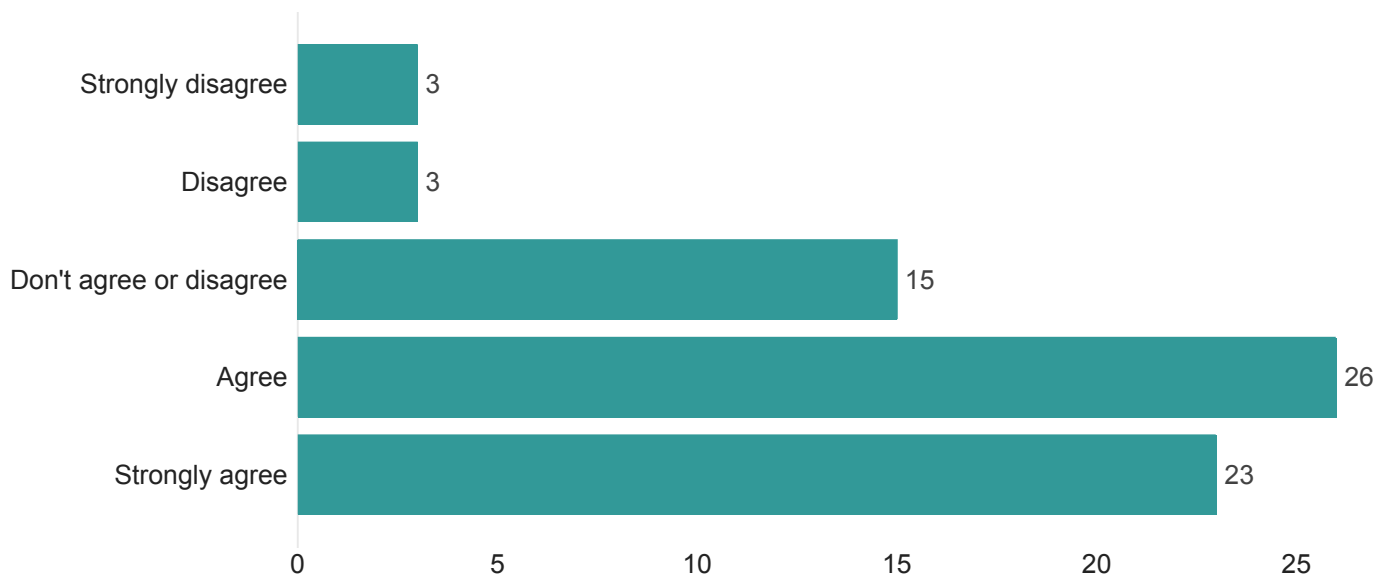

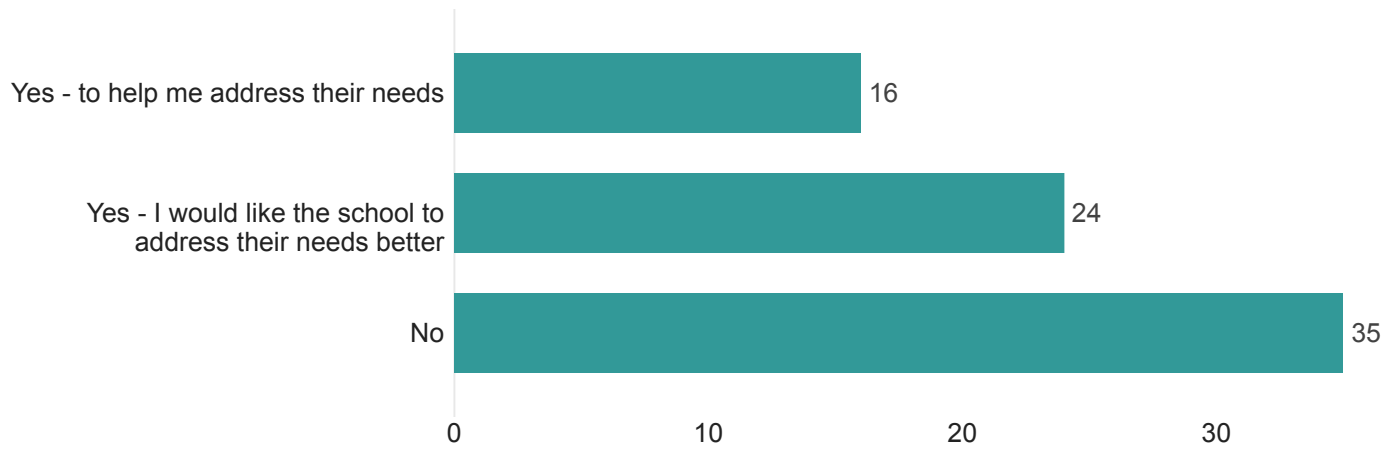

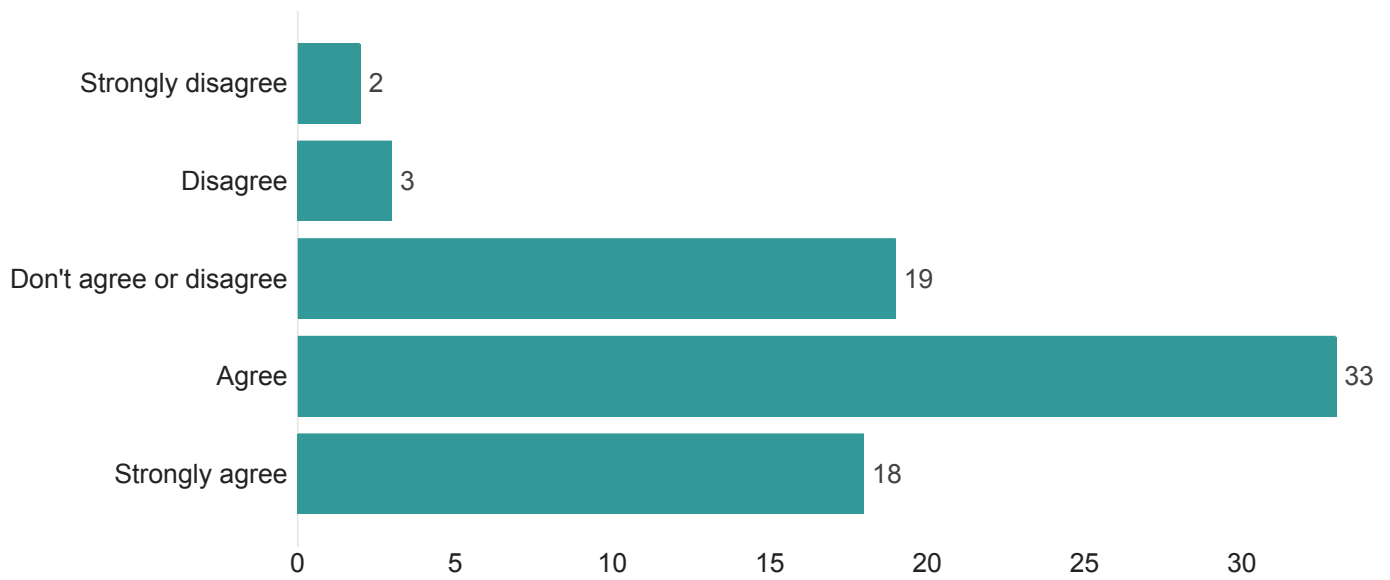

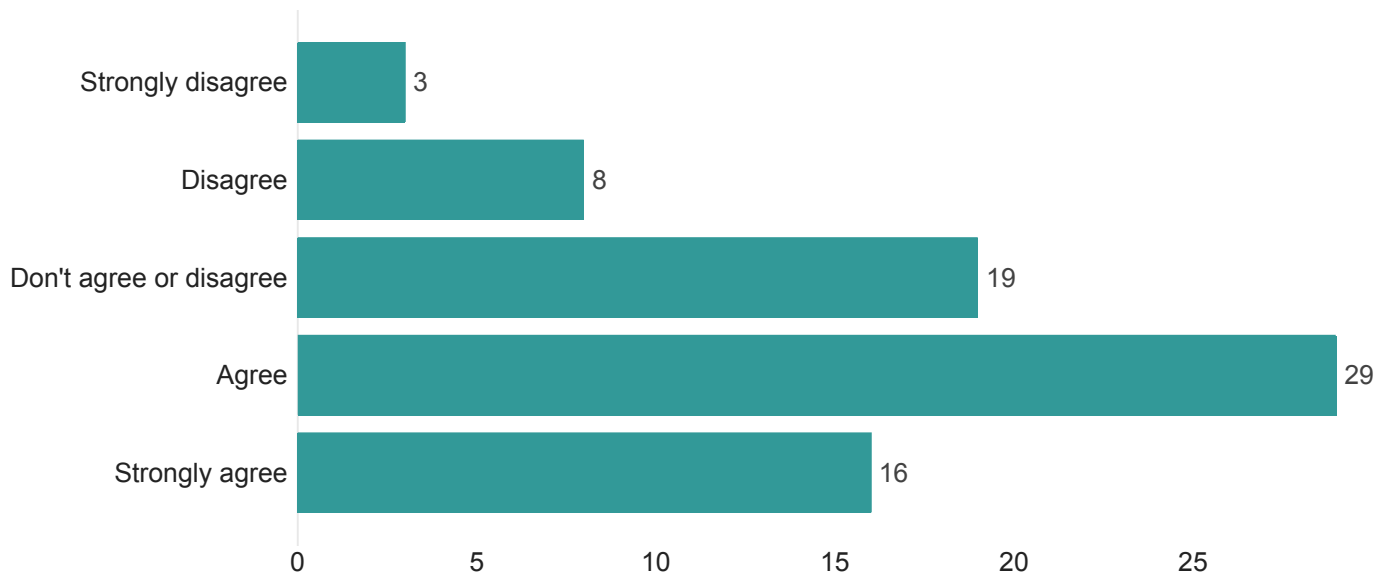

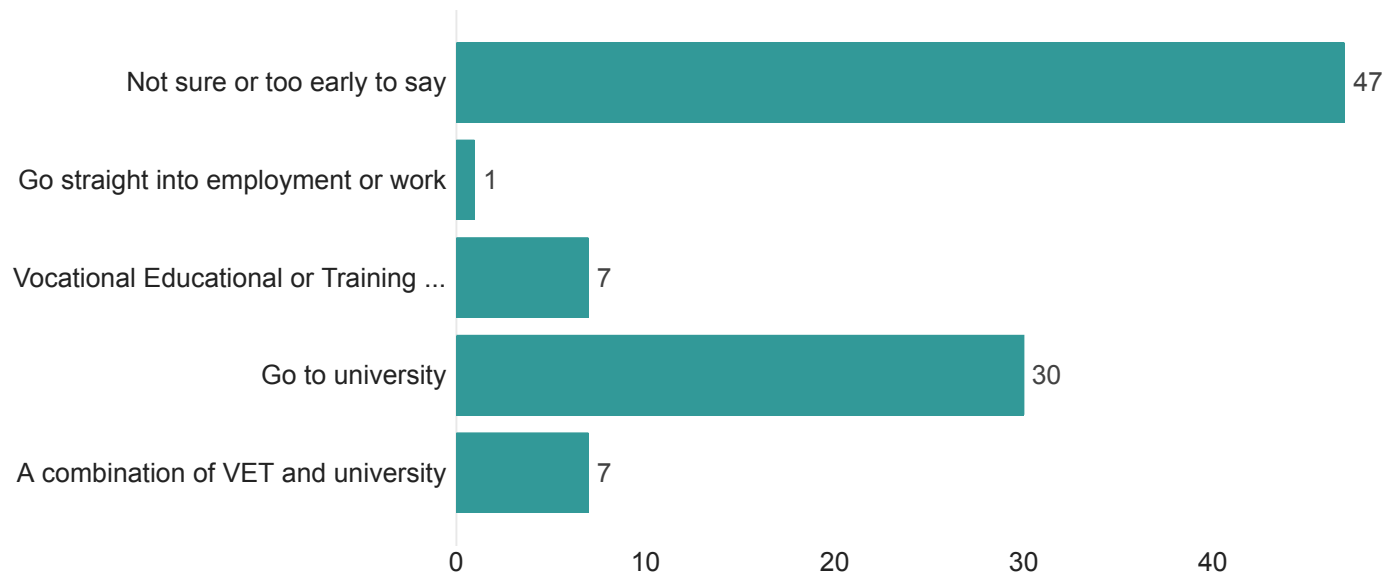

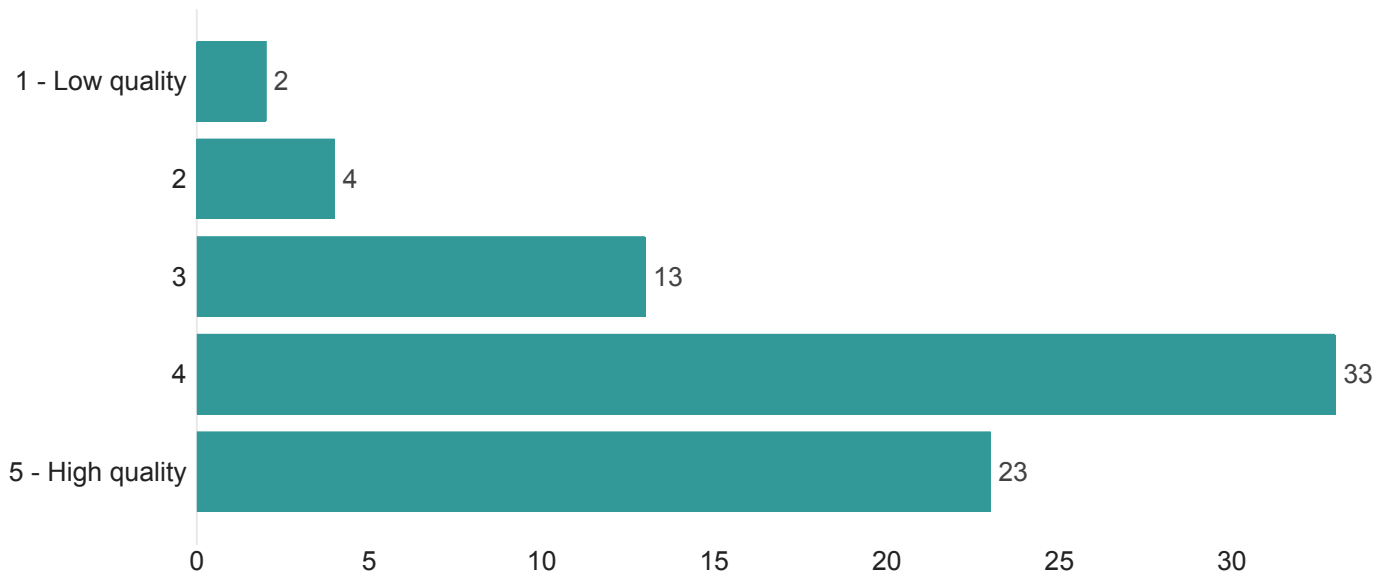
